- SUPERVISION Maureen McCullum, host and producer of *Wisconsin Life* (primary supervisor, training and weekly meetings); Wi101 PA (not a supervisor, but as managing editor for the project; the PA will have very brief check-ins on a weekly basis to monitor the progress of each intern's projects)
- PROJECT Working with Maureen McCullum, the host and producer of <u>Wisconsin Life</u>, this internship will focus on developing up to four feature stories to be aired on the program over the coming year. These feature stories will be developed in partnership between *Wisconsin Life* and *Wisconsin 101: Our History in Objects* and will emphasize telling the local history of the state through objects. The intern will choose object histories and related stories published on *Wisconsin 101* and adapt those stories for presentation on *Wisconsin Life*.
- EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE Students applying for this internship need journalism experience or to have taken a college-level class in news writing. The ideal candidate will also have strong historical writing and research skills, experience in media studies or journalism a plus.
